This resource is a journey that explores generations of experiences and events that are at the root of today's challenges to understand, to heal and to move forward in a good way. There are many resources here starting from the East and moving through the seasons of time that may help with your own journey and your own next steps in teaching others.

Proclamation of 1763: An article from CBC on the 250th anniversary of the proclamation and its significance with many of today's legal challenges. (CBC 2013)

Treaties in Canada: Education Guide: This is an educational resource created by Historica Canada to support teachers with exploring key periods in our relationships with Indigenous peoples. (Historica Canada)

Four Faces of the Moon: Multilayers in its storytelling approach, this short stop animation film by Metis artist Amanda Strong is an invitation to look into your own understanding of history, legacy and the importance of knowing who you are and where you come from. Holy Angels: Jay Cardinal Villeneuve's short documentary captures Canada's colonialist history through images and the fragmented language of a child. It speaks of the resilience of a people who have found ways of healing and of coming home again. (NFB 2017)

Witness Blanket: This website from the Canadian Museum for Human Rights explores the hundreds of items and story related to these items that are the Witness Blanket created by Artist Carey Newman.

Inendi: Sarain Fox sits with her oldest Matriarch to gather her stories and preserve her cultural legacy. (CBC Gems 2020)

Missing Children of Indian Residential Schools: The Academic Data. Honour to Senator Murry Sinclair: Alanis Obomsawin shares the speech the Senator gave when he accepted the WFM-Canada World Peace Award, interspersing the heartbreaking testimonies of formal students imprisoned at residential schools. (NFB 2023)
